# Distribution of Eri Motorized Spinning Machines to Women SHGs

- Distribution of 50 Eri Motorized Spinning Machines and subsequent training.
- Target Population: Women SHGs engaged in Sericulture activities.
- Implemented over a period of 2 months and monitored over 3 months.
- Collaboration between District Administration, Department of Sericulture, RSETI and MGN Fellow, Chirang.

## **Impact**

Two SHGs who received the machines were monitored to observe the subsequent increase in thread production after transitioning from the traditional Takli to Motorized Spinning Machines. Both of them reflected an approximately 250% increase in thread production over a period of 3 months.

These SHGs were also motivated by ASRLM and the Department of Sericulture to procure more Spinning Machines on their own or by taking loans under various Government Schemes.

# **Way Forward**

- Further training and support to the women using these machines would help to increase their efficiency and productivity.
- Under various Government schemes, more women SHGs could be motivated to procure these Spinning Machines to increase their livelihood.
- Collaborating with local institutions, NGOs and agencies to identify and support deserving SHGs.
- Establishing a mechanism for technical support and assistance. SHG members may encounter technical issues while operating these machines.
- Facilitating market linkages for increased thread production.
